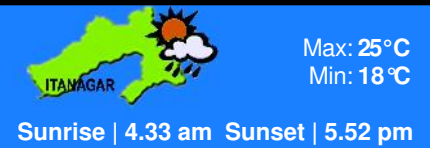

AUS opens with quality as hallmark

By Pradeep Kumar NAMSAI | May 05 | Arunachal University of Studies (AUS) with quality as its hallmark would spread education throughout Arunachal Pradesh by adding a new chapter to educational growth of the state, said Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein here today.

Mein accompanied with Parliamentary Secretaries (PSs) Chow Tewa Mein (Forest & Environment) & Chau Zingnu Namchoom (Tax, Excise & Handicrafts), formally inaugurated the private AUS, its agriculture & science block and laboratory block in a glittering ceremony to the thunder-

ous applause of a huge gathering. The trio was accompanied with Namsai DC R K Sharma, higher & technical education director Dr Tejum Padu.

Pleading for developing sense of competitive spirit for quality education, Mein expressed serious concern at the poor quality of SSA schools. With top priority and zero tolerance to education sector by present Kalikho Pul-led Govt, the poor scenario should change forthwith as it would have a cascading impact in future.

Stressing on nurturing youth as future plan, Mein said AUS would prove to be trend setter, particularly in

conducting research on indigenous agri-horti species for their promotion. "I have applied for patent right of Khampti rice".

Highlighting massive damages caused by natural calamities, particularly flood and landslides in Namsai district recently, Mein urged for scientific steps to check natural calamities a common problem of the district.

"Teachers are first parents and parents are second teachers", goes the adage, he said and advised the students to adopt it to excel in life to become worthy citizens of India and dreamt of a 'sunehra sabera' (Golden future).

Set up in 30 acre lush green campus along NH-52 by global NGO World Education Mission under the GoAP 2012 Act, the event drew the who's who of the area, monks, PRI leaders, GBs, parents and students while AUS Chancellor Kamal Lochan, pro-chancellor Prof KG Goel, Chairman Dr A L Agarwal, VC Prof G N Pandey, Pro-VC Prof Vijaya Lakshmi Pandit, WEM executive director Vishva Lochan were in proactive role when all guests were honoured.

Highlighting state's transition since 1950s with dismal educational scenario, PS Mein hoped the AUS would make Namsai a cen-

tre of learning to provide great opportunities and prove to be a light house for the region. He expressed confidence that it would immensely help in human resource development but advocated good feeder institutes which Namsai presently lacks.

The AUS would be a springboard to meet the much needed educational needs of the region, PS Namchoom, one of the land donors, said and sought the support of one and all to facilitate its growth to achieve the goal.

CM meets Modi, Singh & Paswan

NEW DELHI | May 05 |

Chief Minister Kalikho Pul has asked the Prime Minister Narendra Modi to sanction Rs 12,000 crore for reconstruction of the disaster stricken state affected by the recent natural calamities on Wednesday last. While apprising on the flood situation, the CM said the disaster that struck the state was of unexpected proportions triggered by the unprecedented and torrential pre-monsoon rains. He informed that several districts including Tawang have been severely affected, with 21 persons having lost their lives. Basic infrastructure, which had been created with great difficulty in harsh terrains and in far-flung areas has been completely devastated, added the CM.

Thanking the Prime Minister for sending a central team to assess the flood damage in Tawang, he informed that Rs 12,000 crore reconstruction package for the state would help assuage difficulties faced in all the severely affected districts of Anjaw, Kurung Kumey, Changlang and Tirap as also in every district where minor damages have been caused.

refugee issue, the centre agreed to file a separate curative petition in the Supreme Court in respect to their permanent settlement in the state. This was made on appeal from the Chief Minister who informed that GoAP would also file curative petition shortly.

The Prime Minister assured all central support to the state in reconstruction activities and to mitigate flood induced disasters. As immediate relief, the centre released Rs 66 crore as flood assistance from the National Disaster Response

Fund (NDRF) for the state. To discuss the situation in Tawang and on security related issues in the state, Pul called on Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh same day after the meeting with PM. The situation in Tawang is being constantly monitored, after Monday's firing incident that left two dead and scores other injured, Pul informed.

Special Financial Package of Rs 33,097.02 cr for NE

NEW DELHI | May 05 | A total Rs 33,097.02 crore has been allocated for the North Eastern Region by 56 Central ministries/departments including Rs 2,400 crore provided to the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER), Parliament was informed today.

The budget allocation to DoNER ministry includes funds for the Non-Lapsable Central Pool of Resources (NLCPR) scheme and the North Eastern Council (NEC), Minister of state (independent charge) for Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER) Jitendra Singh said in a written reply in the Rajya Sabha.

In addition, a grant of Rs 1,000 crore has been allocated to Autonomous Councils, areas covered under the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution.

Dr Singh said the Ministry has been receiving, from time to time, proposals from state governments, including through their priority lists for possible funding under the NLCPR scheme and NEC schemes which too had been taken up within the budgetary provisions of the Ministry.

ITANAGAR | May 05 | State Governor JP Rajkhowa, accompanied by state's first lady Rita Rajkhowa called on the Governor of Maharashtra, Chennamaneni Vidyasagar Rao at Raj Bhavan, Mumbai on Wednesday last discussed on various issues related to both States and its people, particularly those studying in Maharashtra.

NAPM condemns Police firing, demands enquiry and halt on Dams

NEW DELHI | May 05 | On May 02 last in an ugly turn of event, two people, namely Monk Nyima Wangdue and Tshering Tenpa, were killed and many injured, while protesting against the arrest of Lama Lobsang Gyatso in Tawang including a young Buddhist Lama. The Victims were protesting for the release of Lama Lobsang Gyatso, one of the most vocal opponents of hydropower projects in the Tawang region and secretary of Save Mon Region Federation (SMRF), an organization of the Monpa Community in the Mon-Tawang region of Arunachal Pradesh. National Alliance of People's Movements condemns this brutal police action on peacefully protesting communities and demands immediate action against the responsible officials.

The State government continues to remain apathetic to the whole situation. Even as Tawang continues to reel under the shock of police firing, State chief minister Kalikho Pul at

ASSOCHAM forum in New Delhi in a complete insensitive statement has advocated for fast-tracking environmental clearances for hydropower projects and suggested single window clearance to the hydro project developers. This only shows complete contempt for the sufferings of the people and environmental destruction and concern for corporate profiteering.

Our experience from struggles against the big dams have shown that, when world over the big dams are being done away with, it is extremely unfortunate that we are still trying to harness the hydro power in the most environmentally sensitive regions, or in densely populated areas, displacing massive populations. Around 250 hydro-power projects are in pipeline in Arunachal Pradesh only, which would prove fatal for the whole north east and Himalayan region. For long, Krishak Mukti Sangram Samiti (KMSS) has been opposed to the Lower Subansri Hy-

droelectric Project, which would threaten the livelihood of more than 5 lakh of fishworkers, farmers and others dependent downstream. It needs to be noted that even though an eight member expert committee report is awaited the construction on dam has started once again, facing challenge from people.

This remains the case for many of the dams in North-East where public hearings have been a complete hogwash and based on half-baked and unscientific conducted Environmental Impact Assessment keeping communities often in dark. The overall planning of hydro development in the State and Himalayan region needs a thorough examination keeping in mind the people's interest first, until then put a moratorium on the planned projects.

Our own experience of struggle against the Narmada, Tehri, Waing Marathwadi, Gosi Khurd and other Dams across the country have exposed the false claim Contd. P.3

7-year jail, Rs 1 crore fine soon for showing PoK, Arunachal as disputed

NEW DELHI | May 05 | Depiction of a wrong map of India or showing Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (PoK) or Arunachal Pradesh as not a part of India on any online platform or physical documents could mean a stiff jail term of seven years along with a heavy fine of up to Rs One Crore, says a new law being proposed by the Narendra Modi government.

The Centre is planning to soon bring the Geospatial Information Regulation Bill by which such tough provisions will be brought and any person or institution acquiring and disseminating any geospatial imagery or data of any part of India through space or aerial platforms will have to first seek permission and license from a government authority. This could mean that online

platforms like Google will have to apply for a license to run Google Maps or Google Earth in India. The government authority will run "sensitivity checks" on the imagery to protect India's security and sovereignty.

The law is meant to regulate the acquisition, dissemination, publication and distribution of geospatial information of India which

is likely to affect the security, sovereignty and integrity of India, as per a draft. Geospatial Information has been defined as any imagery or data acquired through space or aerial platforms such as satellite, aircrafts, airships, balloons, unmanned aerial vehicles or graphical or digital data depicting natural or man-made physical features, phenomenon or boundaries of the

earth or any information including surveys, charts, maps and terrestrial photos, the law says.

Without permission of a Security Vetting Authority which will be duly set up by the government, it has been specified that no person shall, in any manner, make use of, disseminate, publish or distribute any geospatial information of India - either inside India or abroad, with-

out a license. It has been specified that no person shall depict, disseminate, publish or distribute any wrong or false topographic information of India including international boundaries through internet platforms or online services or in any electronic or physical form. The penalties would be seven year jail and One crore fine.

Centre agreed to establish Sainik Schools, PRC in Arunachal



NEW DELHI | May 05 | The centre today agreed to establish two Sainik Schools in Arunachal Pradesh and two permanent recruitment centre (PRC), in view of the increasing recruitment to the ranks of defence forces from the state. Defence Minister Manohar Parrikar agreed to a proposal mooted by Arunachal Chief Minister Kalikho Pul when he called on the latter here at South Block. The CM also met Chief of Army Staff General Dalbir Singh. According to the proposal, two sainik schools, one at Tezu in the eastern region and one at Shergaon in the western region would be established.

On permanent recruitment centre, the Union Minister agreed for establishment of the centre at Tawang for the western zone and Tezu for the eastern zone. The CM mentioned that establishment of Sainik School and a permanent recruitment centre in the state would help local youth join defence forces who are well versed with the local terrain. The Union Minister also agreed to revise the MoA to make easier for use of the Advanced Landing Ground (ALG) used by the defence forces for civilian purposes. This would enable emergency deployment of helicopters in times of emergencies and medical evacuations.

To provide a decent lifestyle for the border communities, the CM pushed for forward area facilities and requested for a special package to build CC foot tracks, permanent foot suspension bridges, hutments, culverts and other infrastructure. According to him, such facilities would prevent border people to migrate to urban areas and easy movement for border patrol. The CM urged the construction and regular maintenance of all border roads to be done by BRO. He informed that two major border roads Joram- Koloriang and Demwe-Hawai had been re-assigned to the BRO. FIFA ethics investigator recommends life ban for ex-VP Jeffrey Webb

ZURICH | May 05 | FIFA's chief ethics investigator has recommended a life ban for Jeffrey Webb, a former vice-president of the global soccer body who has pleaded guilty in the United States to offences linked to racketeering, fraud and money laundering. Webb, one of seven people arrested in Zurich last year before FIFA's annual Congress, is also ex-president of the confederation covering North and Central America and the Caribbean. He is one of 41 individuals and entities indicted following the U.S. Department of Justice's investigation into soccer corruption.

Ronaldo will equal Eusebio in playing 4 CL finals: Portuguese press

LISBON | May 05 | The Portuguese press highlighted on Thursday that Real Madrid's qualification for the Champions League final in Milan will put star forward Cristiano Ronaldo equal to the record of late Portuguese soccer legend Eusebio, who played in four finals of the tournament. "He equals Eusebio: Ronaldo in his fourth final", is the headline on Thursday of the Portuguese newspaper Record, referring to the

achievement which the newspaper A Bola also mentioned on its front page. However, the Black Panther, as Eusebio is lovingly called, only managed to gain the European title -- then called the European Cup -- once, in the 1961-1962 season, because he lost the other three finals with his club Benfica, reports Efe. In contrast, Ronaldo holds two Champions

League titles (one with Manchester United and one with Real Madrid) and lost the final that pitted the English club against Barcelona in the 2008-2009 season. Ronaldo, 31, will have another opportunity on May 28 against Atletico Madrid to equal the record of Eusebio, who died in 2014 and with whom Ronaldo competes to be considered the best Portuguese footballer in history.

CL: Real Madrid edge past Manchester City to set up all-Madrid final

MADRID | May 05 | Real Madrid will face Atletico Madrid in the Champions League final for the second time in three years after overcoming Manchester City 1-0 in their semi-final second leg on Wednesday. Brazilian midfielder Fernando deflected Gareth Bale's cross into his own net after 20 minutes at the Santiago Bernabeu for the only goal of the tie after the first leg ended goalless. Fernandinho came closest to taking City to their first ever Champions League final when his shot clipped the outside of the post a minute before half-time. Real beat Atletico 4-1 after extra time in Lisbon two years ago to win the competition for a 10th time and will be hoping for a repeat when they face Diego

Someone's men in Milan on May 28. "It is another final. It has been very difficult to get there," Madrid defender Sergio Ramos -- whose 93rd-minute header sent the previous final against Atletico into extra time -- told BeIN Sports Spain. "We have shown we know how to win a final and we are going to try and do it again." City's performance over the two legs left much to be desired, but goalkeeper Joe Hart claimed the difference between the sides had been the luck Real enjoyed in the only goal of the game. "We could easily be in the final but they managed the game well," he told BT Sport. "They've beaten us with a very lucky goal but it is

what it is." City manager Manuel Pellegrini's time at the club will come to an end without European glory as he will be replaced at the end of the season by Pep Guardiola. And the Chilean lamented his side's lack of creativity to cause Madrid problems over the two legs. "We worked very well the whole game and that is why Real Madrid couldn't create chances, but after that you need creativity and players who can make the difference in the last third and we lacked that." Real Madrid boss Zinedine Zidane now has the chance to repeat his Champions League success as a player with Real in 2002 in his first season in charge as a coach.

"In a semi-final you always have to suffer, but we've achieved our place in the final," said Zidane. Real were given a huge boost before kick-off as Cristiano Ronaldo made his return after a three-game absence due to a thigh injury. By contrast, City were dealt a massive injury blow inside 10 minutes when captain Vincent Kompany was forced off once more with a muscle problem in an injury-disrupted campaign. Ronaldo was looking to equal his own record of 17 Champions League goals in a season, but sent his first chance well over the bar with a header from Dani Carvajal's cross. However, Madrid got the luck they needed to swing the tie in their favour with their next attack as Bale was

played in on the right of the City box and his intended cross spooned up off Fernando and into the far corner to leave Hart helpless. The difference in European pedigree between the clubs couldn't have been starker as Madrid were playing in their 27th semi-final, whilst City were in the last four for the first time. That inexperience looked to be taking hold as City enjoyed decent spells of first-half possession without troubling the Real defence. However, they came within inches of finding the crucial away goal just before the break when Kevin De Bruyne picked out Fernandinho and the Brazilian midfielder's low driven shot clipped the outside of the post.
